Formula Driven Federal Funds

Ingram Technical College will utilize formula driven funding allocations to maintain employment of instructional resources that would otherwise be reduced by the reduction of state funding from proration and/or reduction of funding through legislative action.

Competitive Grants

Ingram will utilize the competitive grant process to solicit funding to implement additional high wage and high demand instructional programs. Additionally, efforts will focus on integration of green technology advances in the curriculum areas of plumbing, electricity, and HVAC. Emphasis will be placed on instructional sequencing that will provide training in areas of non-traditional skills for women. These efforts will focus on meeting the skilled work force needs based upon the job market demand for the integration of newer technology in the workplace.

Update: Ingram applied for and received funding through the Alabama Department of Economics and Community Affairs, Workforce Development Division, AWIA Section for programs at the LIFETECH Center which serves the needs of females seeking employment in nontraditional employment fields.
